Reviewed 709.1 Video Surveillance Policy | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - CSD has added technology in the past few years that has outdated our current CSD policy. - Annual notification of video recording is important. - Buses are being purchased with video cameras included. - Video footage can be useful when reviewing a situation. - CSD does not currently have software that allows pixilation to block out images of other students. The solution would be to create a still photo and crop it to keep other students out of the image. - If the video becomes part of the student's record, the parent can request records and then access the footage. - The video doesn't have to be shared unless it is a part of a disciplinary procedure. Typically on a case by case basis. - Police are permitted to view video footage. - Re: storage for 10 days, ask Mr. Kase what our capability is. | Follow up with Mr. Kase. |

Reviewed CSD Policy 7.24 and Acceptable Use Policy developed by Mr. Levin</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Consideration of opening Wi-Fi to students. Students would have filtered content the way employees do. Our infrastructure filters out certain sites. Students would have a login and password for a specific device. - Include cell phones (smart phones). - If students are accessing through our network, Facebook can't be accessed. - Goal: making sure students have access to academic programs. - Concerns regarding ability to take videos, pictures and post from cell phones, laptops and iPads. - Recommendation is to disable video capability in phones, laptops and iPads. - Teaching students appropriate expectations and a level of responsibility. - Privacy law: illegal to video a teacher or student. - Goals: when the students are working academically, the students need the tools. They need to be responsible with technology. - Students take photos of notes on the board to save time writing the notes. A laptop or iPad keyboard would help students take notes vs handwriting them. - The policy speaks to protection of legal rights of everyone in the building and issues with those creating a substantial disruption in the learning environment. - Communication norms between adults and students is covered. - Breaking into the network is addressed in this policy. - Communication with students question regarding Nixle and how it fits in with regard to students reporting anonymous tips. - BWTV is a tool at William Tennent that can be utilized to educate students about consequences of misuse of technology. | |
