2. 224. Care of School Property	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- This policy was reviewed and discussed. The policy guides response to damage that is willful and intentional (eg. vandalism). As per the MOU, the police will be called for intentional property damage and also, for insurance reasons, if unintentional property damage occurs.</li> <li>- This policy is acceptable as written. It will be presented to the Board for initial distribution/discussion at the January 10, 2017 Board meeting.</li> </ul>	
3. 224.1 Student Indebtedness	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- This policy was reviewed and discussed. The committee talked about reasons that a student would be responsible to pay a debt (eg. doesn't return a book, a uniform, a lock for a locker). Administration works with students and families to repay debt. The district can hold a transcript of a student who owes money to the district.</li> <li>- This policy is acceptable as written. It will be presented to the Board for initial distribution/discussion at the January 10, 2017 Board meeting.</li> </ul>	
4. 225. Relations with Law Enforcement Agencies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- This policy was reviewed and discussed. The policy guides when we report an incident to the police. The policy addresses the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with our local police departments, which guides response to offenses and emergencies.</li> <li>- This policy is acceptable as written. It will be presented to the Board for initial distribution/discussion at the January 10, 2017 Board meeting.</li> </ul>	
5. 226. Searches	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- This policy was reviewed and discussed at length. The policy is necessary as school searches have made their</li> </ul>	

	<p>way to the supreme court.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- School Districts must allow searches to protect the safety and welfare of all students and staff.</li> <li>- Administrators need reasonable suspicion to conduct the search of a student, his/her possessions and/or his/her car. Locker searches can take place randomly.</li> <li>- A question was asked about whether or not student's phones can be searched. Dr. Polinchock stated that searching students phones can be risky because an administrator searching a student's phone may see something that is not relevant to the search and not appropriate for the administrator to see. Administrators are likely to call the police if there is reasonable suspicion that the phone needs to be searched.</li> <li>- Teachers are not permitted to search students or their belongings; only an administrator may search a student.</li> <li>- This policy is acceptable as written. It will be presented to the Board for initial distribution/discussion at the January 10, 2017 Board meeting.</li> </ul>	
6. 227. Controlled Substances/Paraphernalia	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- This policy was reviewed and discussed. The policy lists controlled substances; look alike drugs are prohibited as well.</li> <li>- Discipline for possession/use of a controlled substance can result in expulsion.</li> <li>- A question was asked about whether the district can test for drugs or if a parent must test. The answer is that administration may choose either scenario, depending on the situation.</li> <li>- This policy is acceptable as written. It will be presented to the Board for initial distribution/discussion at the January 10, 2017 Board meeting.</li> </ul>	
7. 228. Student Government	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- This policy was reviewed and discussed.</li> <li>- This policy is acceptable as written. The policy will be presented to the Board for initial distribution/discussion at the January 10, 2017 Board meeting.</li> </ul>
