904. PUBLIC ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL EVENTS	
1. Purpose	The Board welcomes the public at activities and events sponsored by the School District, but the Board also acknowledges its duty to maintain order and preserve school facilities during such events. When an event occurs during the school day, please refer to Policy 907. Visitors.
2. Definition 35 P.S. Sec. 1223.5 Policy 222	For purposes of this policy, tobacco includes a lighted or unlighted cigarette, cigar, pipe or other smoking product and smokeless tobacco in any form. Smoking includes a lighted or unlighted cigarette, cigar, pipe or other smoking product or material, smokeless tobacco in any form, vaping, e-cigarettes and other tobacco look-alike products. Vaping and e-cigarettes are defined as any oral device or product that provides a vapor of liquid nicotine, lobelia, and/or other substance/flavor and the use or inhalation of which simulates or substitutes for smoking, regardless of under what name they are sold.
3. Authority SC 511, 775	The Board has the authority to prohibit at a school event the attendance of any individual whose conduct may constitute a disruption. The Board prohibits gambling and the possession and use of controlled substances, alcoholic beverages and weapons on school premises.
4. Guidelines	A schedule of fees for attendance at school events shall be prepared by the Superintendent.
35 P.S. Sec. 1223.5 20 U.S.C. Sec. 7181 et seq	<u>Tobacco</u>  The Board prohibits tobacco use by any persons in its school buildings and on any property, buses, vans and vehicles that are owned, leased or controlled by the School District.
SC 1302.1-A, 1303-A Title 22 Sec. 10.2, 10.22 18 Pa. C.S.A.	The Superintendent may report incidents involving the sale of tobacco to minors by any person on school property, at any school-sponsored activity or on a conveyance providing transportation to or from a school or school-sponsored activity to the local police department that has jurisdiction over the school's property, in accordance with Applicable Law, the procedures set forth in the memorandum of understanding

<p>SC 1303-A Pol. 805.1</p>	<p>In accordance with state law, the Superintendent shall annually, by July 31, report all incidents of possession, use or sale of tobacco by any person on school property to the Office for Safe Schools on the required form.</p>
<p>35 P.S. Sec. 1223.5</p>	<p>The District shall annually notify staff, parents/guardians and members of the public about the District's tobacco policy by publishing such in handbooks, newsletters, posted notices, and other efficient methods.</p>
	<p><u>Gold Cards</u></p>
	<p>Senior citizens who are District residents and are fifty-five (55) years of age or older are eligible to be admitted without charge to all home athletic events (except certain playoff games governed by P.I.A.A. regulations), dramatic productions, and musical programs at any school location upon presentation of a gold card. Senior citizens may acquire a gold card at any School District building.</p>
	<p><u>Discounted Admission</u></p>
	<p>Senior citizens who are not District residents and are fifty-five (55) years of age or older will be admitted, with identification, at the discounted student rate to all home athletic events (except certain playoff games governed by P.I.A.A. regulations), dramatic productions, and musical programs.</p>
	<p>Active and former members of the military will be admitted, with valid military identification, at the discounted student rate to all home athletic events (except certain playoff games governed by P.I.A.A. regulations), dramatic productions, and musical programs.</p>
