224-AR-0. LOSS/DAMAGE/REPLACEMENT OF DISTRICT MATERIALS

Books, materials, supplies, equipment and furniture used by students are the property of the District.

Teachers will instruct students about their responsibility to take pride in the school and to take proper care of books, materials, supplies and furnishings.

Students are fully responsible for loss and damage of school and District property. Students who willfully cause loss or damage to school or District property will be subject to disciplinary measures in accordance with the applicable Code of Student Conduct. The costs of repair and/or replacement of books, materials, supplies, equipment and furniture caused by damage or loss will be charged to the responsible student.

The building principal will determine the required cost of repair or replacement. The charge will be based on the extent of damage or loss and will be commensurate with the value of the object. Value will be determined by the remaining life of the object and its replacement or repair cost.

The building principal will follow Board Policy and administrative regulations for Policy 224.1. Student Indebtedness for notifying parents/guardians and collecting the debt.

224-AR-1. VANDALISM TO DISTRICT PROPERTY

The Superintendent is authorized to seek restitution for vandalism to any District property by students and others and will submit a report to the Board on incidences of vandalism.

Vandalism of District property includes, but is not limited to, the following acts:

1. Breaking into and illegally entering a District building.
2. Defacing, writing, marking or placing any obscene or improper matter upon any District building, or District property, or property leased or contracted by the District.
3. Defacing, damaging or destroying any school furniture, supplies, books or equipment or other materials contained in District buildings, or on District property, or property leased or contracted by the District.
4. Destroying any landscaping, fencing, playground equipment or other structures on District property.

Building principals and District administrators will report to the Superintendent any instance of property damage, destruction or defacing and the circumstances of the occurrence.

The Superintendent will evaluate each occurrence of vandalism of District property and determine if the accused student and/or others will be referred to law enforcement for prosecution for criminal mischief and compensation for damages.

The Superintendent may recommend that the Board report to juvenile authorities a student whose vandalism had been serious or chronic in nature, after prior notification of the parents/guardians.
