## FIELD HOCKEY: William Tennent and Archbishop Wood battle to tie

WARMINSTER — It was a much-anticipated game by both teams. But in the end neither could find a way to win it.

Despite game efforts from both sides, the William Tennent and Archbishop Wood field hockey teams dueled to a 0-0 overtime tie Monday's non-league encounter.

The Warminster rivals stopped playing each other for a number of years but picked up the annual contest again in 2012, although they did not meet last season. Tennent won in 2012 and 2013 with Wood taking the 2014 meeting.

"This is a good rivalry and we wanted to win," Tennent goaltender Tricia McCoy said. "It was really an intense game. Both teams really played hard. Our defense did a great job. They always have my back."

Wood outshot the Panthers 10-6 and held an 11-7 edge in corners with four of those corners coming in the overtime frame.

"We had a lot more opportunities but we're such a young group," Wood coach Dipi Bhaya said. "We're still trying to learn how to find the back of the net but we never gave up, we hustled. I was really proud of my defense and of Kayley Hence in goal."

"We just need to put the ball in the cage. We do all that work and I like them to feel rewarded at the end with a goal but we'll figure it

out.”

Wood senior Mary Ann Powell attended Tennent as a freshman.

“I know a lot of the girls on their team,” Powell said. “I hadn’t seen some of them in a long time so it was fun to play against them. We really wanted to win this game but I’m not disappointed at all because we played really hard. I think we kept it on their end a lot. We had a lot of chances and didn’t score and that was a little frustrating but that’s a learning experience.

“Both teams worked really hard and I think this game was good for both of us.”

Tennent extends its winless streak to six games.

“We’re a very young team and the biggest thing is that our passing and possession skills are improving,” Tennent coach Kaitlyn Rauch said. “Scoring has been our biggest challenge.

“This was definitely a challenging game. Wood played phenomenal and I’m very proud of my players and the energy and intensity they brought. It was fun to watch.”
